WELCOME BACK

A very warm welcome back to all of our families. We have had an extremely positive start this term and myself and the staff are incredibly proud of the enthusiastic and focused start that the children have made to this term, especially as summer has made a late appearance this week! children have coped very well with the heat this week, although there were lots of tired children by the end of the day today — partly because of the heat, but mainly because of the effort they have been putting into their learning. The hot weather has also allowed us to enjoy the newly installed air conditioning in the Dining Hall.

I am especially pleased to see how well the children who are new to the school have integrated into their classes and the friendly and supportive way their peers have made them feel welcome – feedback from the children has been that they are enjoying being in their new school.

Our Reception Class are now full-time after a slightly staggered start and have been busy learning in their classroom. The reception classroom had a bit of a make-over during the summer break, with new flooring being installed.

We are incredibly grateful to Mr Bradley Hayward, a parent of two children in school, who donated the flooring, including installation as a thank you to the school. This generous gift will also see other floors in school being upgraded in the near future.









SCHOOL & NURSERY PLACES

We are currently beginning to organise tours for families with children who will be in Reception next September. If you have a child of Nursery age and would like a full school tour, then please contact the school office. Please also mention this to friends who are not familiar with Laburnum and I would be very pleased to show them all that our school has to offer.

As some parents know, we keep a Nursery entry register in the school office. We usually have a little capacity in our Nursery, but it really does help us to plan staffing and finance in advance if we have future children listed on our register. If you have a child under the age of 3 and you would like them to attend out Nursery, please do contact the school office – we have had several children listed since birth, so it is never too early to put their name down! Please also encourage friends who don't yet have children at the school to contact us as we would welcome the opportunity to show them our school and nursery.

DATES & INVITATIONS!

The dates list for the year is included later in the newsletter – dates of school visits, FLS events and Class Assemblies will be added over the coming weeks.

Mrs Dawes and I would like to welcome any parents who would like to, to an informal Senior Leaders drop-in on Friday 14th September in the Dining Hall. This will be the first of a series of regular opportunities across the year in a slightly less formal setting and without the need to make an appointment. Parents will be from to come across as they drop their children as school in the morning (8:45)— tea/coffee and biscuits will be available and you are more than welcome to bring your pre-school children with you too. There is no agenda – just an opportunity to ask any questions you may have in relation to school. If your question is very specific we may suggest a private meeting at another time.

VOLUNTEERS IN SCHOOL

We are always grateful to parents who can volunteer some time to help in school and we can guarantee you a very warm welcome. Volunteering can be either as a block of time e.g. an afternoon, or one or more short sessions at the end of the day to read with children.

If you would like to help in school, please contact the school office. They will ask you to complete a simple form and will also process a DBS check.

We also host volunteers who are undertaking childcare and education qualifications – this year we are again hosting the Central Bedfordshire Support Work in School Course, starting on 12th October. This was very successful, with 3 of the attendees who volunteered in school last year, now working at Laburnum as Teaching Assistants.

FOOD AND DRINK REMINDERS

Please remember:

- Water bottles brought into school should only contain water.
- If your child has a packed lunch it is useful to pack an additional smaller drink with this.
- All break-time snacks should be raw fruit or vegetables only.
- Hot cooked dinners are free for every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.
- Packed lunches should not contain sweets and there should really only be one sweet item such as a small cake or biscuit bar; and only one pot/packet of crisps or similar. Children need a carbohydrate based lunch e.g. sandwich, wrap, roll etc. to give them longer term energy to last the day. Some families vary this with rice, pasta and crackers. We encourage children to eat their 'main' item (sandwich etc.) first and certainly before anything sweet.
- We are a no nuts school! Under no circumstances should children bring in any nuts or nut containing items as we have several children with severe allergies and nuts pose a significant risk to their health.







PLEASE HELP

WE NEED YOUR HELP TO ACCESS FUNDING TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD

Could your child be entitled to free school meals?

We know that lots of parents have not applied, but are eligible and their child is missing out on the support they could be receiving.

We could offer your child many benefits if they are entitled:

- Free breakfast club
- £50 school uniform voucher per year
- Reduced costs on school trips, music lessons, after school clubs
- Free break-time milk
- Extra learning support in and out of class.

All of these benefits could make a significant difference to your child.



All children in reception class, year 1 and year 2 automatically qualify for a free school meal under the Government's Universal Free School Meals scheme **BUT** any child in Reception – Year 6 could still qualify for free school meals (and therefore the benefits listed above) if you are in receipt of the following –

- Income Support, or
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance, or
- Employment and Support Allowance (income-related), or
- Guarantee Element of the State Pension Credit, or
- National Asylum Seekers Support (NASS), or
- Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit) and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190.

IF YOU THINK THERE IS ANY CHANCE YOUR CHILD COULD BE ELIGIBLE - PLEASE APPLY

IT MAKES A BIG DIFFERENCE TO OUR SCHOOL BUDGET AND THE SUPPORT WE CAN PROVIDE

Once your child is identified as eligible their school receives additional funding each April (in the budget) for the next 6 years.













