

The Rebuild Programme is a 12-week group programme looking at healthy relationships.

It's designed for women living with domestic abuse in Central Bedfordshire, and will explore what healthy relationships look like, conflict in relationships, the dynamics of domestic abuse and the impact it has on relationships.

It will also give women the opportunity to have a oneto-one with the programme facilitator towards the end of the programme, and make a plan for their future.



We recognise a young carer to be a child or young person aged 5-17 who looks after someone in their family who has an illness, disability, mental health, or substance misuse problem, who takes on practical and/or emotional caring responsibilities which normally are expected of an adult.

### Young carers may:

- Carry out practical tasks such as cooking, shopping, washing, or cleaning
- Help with money
- Look after their brothers and sisters.
- Offer other practical and emotional support.
- Collecting and giving medications

### What do we offer?

- Access to wellbeing support
- Chatterbooks book clubs held at libraries across Central Bedfordshire
